The GED (General Educational Development) program offers adults the chance to earn a high school equivalency credential. Completing it can open the way to better jobs, career training, and college.

Classes make the GED a realistic and rewarding goal, as they are:

ESL (ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE)

ESL programs help non-native speakers skills in speaking, listening, reading, and writing.

Classes prepare students to communicate in daily life, succeed in school or work, and build confidence in English-speaking communities.

They may also support the following with levels ranging from beginner to advanced:

- GED preparation
- Job Readiness
- U.S. Citizenship
- Life Skills



CITIZENSHIP PREPARATION

Citizenship programs guide immigrants through the naturalization process. Students practice English skills while studying U.S. history, government, and civics.

To help participants understand their rights and responsibilities as future citizens, classes also include:

- Citizenship Test
- Interview Prep



DIGITAL LITERACY

Digital literacy programs give adults essential computer and online skills.

Online safety and privacy are emphasized. These skills help participants thrive in school, work, and daily life.

- Learners are taught to use:
- A Keyboard and Mouse
 - Website Navigation
 - Email management
 - Software like Word, Excel, and Google Tools
